A bigger dog weighing 65 pounds would require about 7 cups of water depending on climate, exercise and diet. We suggest the k9-h2o Dog pack be used on all hikes, walks and trips to the dog park

The bladder has two drinking tubes, one for the owner and a longer one for the dog. The longer drinking tube is around hip height and makes it easier to give your dog a drink

This means that the owner does not have to bend over so far when giving the dog a drink. *The owner does not have their face right next to the dogs mouth, which by the way continually keeps you wet with water and slobber, like when you use a standard hydration pack. *You only need the one pack to go on your walks or day hikes. *You do not have to carry a dog bowl *you do not have to carry an extra water bottle *You gain extra storage space in the bag, as a separate container for your dog to drink from is not necessary. *A poop bag pocket which holds 2 rolls of poop bags. *A cell phone pocket *Plenty of compartments for storage *Key clip inside storage compartment *2 smaller storage areas inside main storage compartments *Soft padding and air ducts so your back stays cool

Hydration pack for dogs

- <u>5.</u> www.lifeofapup.comwww.lifeofapup.com Both drinking tubes have a start/stop valve as well as a bite valve. If you want to give the dog water, you can squeeze the bite valve and the water syphons from the bladder. If you want a steady flow, you can remove the bite valve from stop/start valve and this will give you a continuous flow of water. This dog hydration pack can be used on short walks to the park or long day hikes in the hills. The bladder holds three liters of water which should be enough water for both the dog and you.
- 6. www.lifeofapup.comwww.lifeofapup.com There is a poop bag pocket located on the waist strap of the bag. It holds 2 rolls of poop bags which can be pulled out through a special outlet in the side of the zippered compartment. So no running out of poop bags with this handy pocket. On the same waist belt, on the opposite side is another zippered pocket for treats, both these pockets are reachable without removing the dog hydration bag. On the shoulder strap on the left hand side we have placed a cell phone pocket that can be accessed easily. There are two large compartments both of which unzip three quarters of the way down on both sides for easy access. In the smaller of the two pockets, there is a key clip along with a 6" by 6" open pocket, and 2 smaller pockets, one which is meshed and the other one is a normal pocket. Both of these pockets are 5.5" long by 2.5" wide for holding smaller items that you might need access to quickly. The larger pocket is 19" long by 8.5" wide and also has 2 zips that open the pocket three quarters the way down both sides. On the back of this pocket, is another zippered small pocket which is 5" by 5".
- 7. www.lifeofapup.comwww.lifeofapup.com There is a cinch belt on each side, to pull the bag tighter, so when the bladder is getting low on water it will keep pressure on the bladder and it will still syphon properly. The dog hydration bag has soft padding that is vented for airflow so your back can breathe and stay cool. There is an easy grip handgrip for carrying the bag to and from the car. I walk my dogs twice a day and I never leave home without my k9-h2o water pack.

SERVICE DOGS SHINE AT INVICTUS GAMES

Anyone with a service dog will attest to their loyalty, dedication, and love. At the Invictus Games this week, service dogs took their responsibilities to the next level, helping their owners compete and even taking some gold medals.

The Invictus Games, held in Orlando, Florida (May 8-12), give wounded, ill, and injured service men and women the opportunity to compete in sports such as powerlifting, swimming, and wheelchair basketball. Many of the competitors have service dogs who accompanied them to the Games.

Christine Gauthier, who won a gold medal in heavyweight powerlifting, attributes her win to her service dog, Batak. "Without my dog, I wouldn't be here," she told the Orlando Sentinel.

These service dogs help their owners with conditions such anxiety, PTSD, and depression. The dogs also often aid with mobility, which is particularly important to many of these athletes.

Retired Special Operations Command Sergeant Leonard Anderson won a gold medal in the 100-meter freestyle and praised his service dog, Azza, for everything she does for him.

"Everything I do, everything I've ever competed in, everything ever since the injury has mostly been with her," he told ABC News. Throughout the games this week, the presence of service dogs was celebrated and recognized among competitors and audience members alike.

A retired police dog who was shot in the line of duty two years ago has died of complications from his injuries.

In March 2014, K-9 **Bruno**, a German Shepherd Dog with the Anaheim Police Department in California, was injured when he and his partner, Officer RJ Young, were on the trail of an armed suspect. The suspect opened fire and a bullet went through Bruno's jaw and chest, collapsing his lung.

Bruno managed to survive the attack, after undergoing six weeks of veterinary care and multiple surgeries. He was retired from service and lived with Officer Young as a family pet. Later that year, the American Kennel Club presented Bruno with the Award for Canine Excellence.

But on May 18, Bruno had to undergo emergency surgery due to complications from the injury. Unfortunately, his organs failed and he passed away with Officer Young by his side.

"Bruno was a warrior to the end and we will never forget OUR HERO!"

The happy kisses rain upon your face; your hands again caress the beloved head, and you look once more into the trusting eyes of your pet, so long gone from your life but never absent from your heart.


